

## **THE CREED OF FASCISM**

The object of British Fascism is to set up a Corporate State, this is built on the analogy of the human body which is composed of many millions of cells all working in harmony. The State is composed of many human individuals who ought to be organised together to serve the State as the cells of the body are organised to serve the body.

The members of one industry be they workers or employers should combine together to carry out their function in society as do the cells of the human arm combine together to carry out their function in the interest of the body.

Actually individuals are rapidly losing any sense of fulfilling a basic function for the benefit of the community, under the cover of democracy and the fetish of individual liberty, men engage in making a living by striving and competing against their fellow men to gain a share of the spoils of civilisation. Fascism teaches that this is the wrong attitude to adopt, and is the inevitable cause of the present distress and economic futility.

In order to enable individuals to carry out their proper function in society Fascism intends to reorganise the industrial life of the country under a system of discipline and control with a minimum of interference with private property and established institutions.

Existing industries would be placed under the control of Corporations on which would sit representatives of the employers through their Federations, representatives of the workers through their Trade Unions, and representatives of the consumers these Corporations would then fix fair prices, eliminating cut-throat competition, and fair rates of wages, preventing exploitation.

All these Corporations would be under the control of the National Corporation, to take the place of the present House of Lords, whose duty it would be to direct the various industries to the best interest of the State and of the community. The National Corporation would also fix the national standard of wage rates so that the people could consume the goods they produce.

Undoubtedly in order to set up such a highly organised state of society revolutionary methods would be required, and a temporary dictatorship set up with power to over-ride all sectional interests, especially those of high finance which would resist co-ordination. Once having established the new system, however, all citizens would have the power to take part in developing their particular industry or profession to the best advantage of the State, and would have the right to express their opinion of how best this would be accomplished.

Not only would they be able to influence public affairs once every few years by general election, but they would be able to have their say in their Trade Unions, Employers Federations, and very much more prominent occasions, and furthermore, a new House of Commons would be instituted on an occupational, in place of a regional franchise People would vote according to their trade or profession, doctors would be represented by doctors, teachers by teachers, builders by builders, in fact a house of experts would be returned, capable of giving advice on every matter of public interest.

In the present state of society, Fascism finds only one great symbol about which it can build up the greater Britain of the future. this symbol is the Crown, Fascism in Britain is loyal to the Queen and Royal Family, because it recognises them alone as standing high above the fractional strife, class war, and the political rivalry of modern existence. We are grateful indeed that there is one institution in this country about which we can gather our growing effort for the regeneration of our country. An institution which has weathered the storms of political controversy in the past and carries down its glorious tradition of service to the Nation.
